Danish citizenship

We can advise you on the terms and process regarding Danish citizenship. We can help you fill out and submit the application.

About the Voluntary Advisory Service How can we help you?

At DRC Danish Refugee Council's Voluntary Advisory Service, refugees and people with a minority background can get free, impartial and interdisciplinary counseling.

We can advise on family reunification, permanent residence and Danish citizenship. We can also help with understanding verdicts, letters from public authorities, provide information about appeal options and more.

Unfortunately, we are unable to help with finding housing, advising on social benefits, or conducting legal proceedings. We also do not provide advice on asylum. If you have questions about asylum or repatriation (voluntary return to homeland), please contact **DRC Danish Refugee Council Asylum**.

If we do not have a volunteer interpreter available, or if we cannot find a volunteer interpreter for your language, please bring someone over the age of 18 whom you trust who can interpret for you.




Who provides the counselling?
